

2) Creation process of ITTS (2): Legal base



- Contribution to the development of new knowledge by scientific studies in social work




4) What is specific about the ITTS & its PhD?

A collaboration of UniNE and the School of social work of the UAS Western Switzerland – and of the UAS Northwestern Switzerland starting January 1st 2025

PhD students are supported by a PhD programme (in English)

First institute specifically and exclusively for the PhD in social work in Switzerland



Transdisciplinary perspective as PhD thesis are co-directed by a professor of a UAS in social work and by a professor of UniNF

PhD title in social work delivered by University of Neuchâtel

(in collaboration with HES-SO and FHNW)

Open to holders of a MA of an UAS or a UNI in social work, social sciences, law and economics



5) Global definition of social work

The following definition was approved by the IFSW General Meeting and the IASSW General Assembly in July 2014:

Global Definition of the Social Work Profession

"Social work is a practice-based profession and an academic discipline that promotes social change and development, social cohesion, and the empowerment and liberation of people. Principles of social justice, human rights, collective responsibility and respect for diversities are central to social work. Underpinned by theories of social work, social sciences, humanities and indigenous knowledges, social work engages people and structures to address life challenges and enhance wellbeing. The above definition may be amplified at national and/or regional levels."



6) How does ITTS consider social work as discipline?

Qualitative, mixed methods, theories in social work International definition of social work: agency, social justice, social change, taking into account different types of knowledge

Quantitative methods for social sciences, social policy

Individuals, groups, access, social problems, professional developments, interventions and social politics

Vulnerabilities, inequalities, participation, management, professional identification, social responsability, social policy, migration, ecology, disabilities, poverty, artificial intelligence, professional integration, child protection, LGBTQI+, ageing, social crisis

Social work as a discipline and science of action, internationally comparative approach

8) Why do you need a PhD in social work?

Because you are curious and keen to achieve new, systematic, solid, empirical knowledge about a specific question on a social problem

Because you plan to pursue an academic career in the discipline of social work, do high level research, funded by science bodies, and teach future social workers at BA, MA and PhD level

> Because you strife for the equal recognition of professional knowledge in the action oriented discipline of social work next to medical doctors, lawyers, psychologists and pedagogues

Because you need to demonstrate a scientifically founded positionality for an officially recognised leadership role in your institutional field of social work



9) How to plan and to finance a PhD?



You need time (at least 2 days a week) Your planning goes over 5 years (10 semesters), limit given by the regulations of the Faculty of Economics and Business at UniNE



You need to be able to finance this time:

- Participate as an FNS researcher in a project
- Work as a (part-time) teaching and / or research assistant in a UAS of social work or at UNI
- Work part-time in a social institution (max. 60%)
- Apply for grants







The 7 steps to start a PhD at ITTS

Information session

Attend an information session, they happen twice a year, in **November** and in February

Eligibility

Check your eligibility with the ITTS

- · Contact ITTS to announce your interest
- Send your MA grades reports and diploma
- Send a short text with your considered thesis topic

Once and if your eligibility has been confirmed, start looking for your two thesis supervisors

- One Professor or MER from UniNE, from any of the Faculties
- One Professor from a Swiss UAS-HES

Get an acceptance letter from both supervisors

Application

PhD supervisors

Before April 30th, send your formal application for the doctoral program to the ITTS.

You will receive an answer by May 15th.

Once your acceptance into the program has been confirmed, **Registration at UniNE** complete the registration process with UniNE's academic office (Bureau des Immatriculations)

Your 30ECTS

30ECTS you will earn within the first 18months of your PhD, in consultation with your PhD supervisors and the director of the ITTS. Get the program validated and signed by all parties

Start the PhD Start the PhD program in September!



12) Structure of the PhD program

Each PhD-student must complete 30 ECTS during the first 18 months.

The PhD student decides upon its own programme, together with the two codirectors and the direction of the ITTS.

The individual programme of 30 ECTS is listed in the pedagogical agreement.

The participation in **international** seminars, conferences are encouraged and the **ITTS** / FSE **support** these **partications financially**.
